



MUCOPURULENT CERVICITIS (MPC)

Mucopurulent Cervicitis (MPC) is a general diagnosis of an infection or inflammation of the cervix. It may or may not be due to a sexually transmitted infection (STI).

MPC causes can be related to bacteria that causes chlamydia and/or gonorrhea. Other cervical/vaginal infections such as Bacterial Vaginosis (BV), yeast infection or Trichomoniasis can cause MPC.

MPC causes symptoms such as vaginal discharges that have an odor, are yellowish in color. Also there may be spotting in between your periods. Pain during intercourse is also common.

MPC is preventable by abstinence, monogamy and condom use. Do not douche as it can disrupt the natural balance of bacteria in the vagina.
